Cold and Snow: Get in the Know!

As you gear up for winter's long haul, take note of these helpful tips for keeping your beloved pets safe and healthy.

✓ Take shorter walks.

✓ Do not leave ANY PET outside for long periods.

 \checkmark Honk your horn before starting your car to dislodge a cat that may be under the hood.

✓ Wipe down your dog's feet, legs, and belly after walks in case they've picked up toxic de-icing chemicals.
✓ Provide appropriate shelter for animals that must stay outside. Including unlimited access to fresh, nonfrozen water (change water frequently or use a pet-safe, heated water bowl). Make sure the floor of the shelter is off of the ground (to minimize heat loss into the ground), and bedding should be thick, dry and changed regularly. The door should be positioned away from prevailing winds.

It's also a great idea to provide shelter for feral or stray animals that might wander onto your property! Adapted from American Veterinary Medical Association guidelines
